**Recommendations by the participants in a workshop on Integrity  
Baghdad – 25-26 September 2019**

**Recommendations to the Government of Iraq:**

- 1- Issue executive orders to implement a proper employment system for the General Managers and special grade positions away from political distributions.
- 2- Implementing the Political Parties Law articles that address political party financing and scope of work, and enforce the principle of declaration of budget and assets, and set limitations on the campaign financing.
- 3- Provide whistleblower protection to all individuals, organizations and contributors to exposing corruption.
- 4- Work towards open government standards through adopting e-government services to all financial transactions to reduce petty corruption, in addition to adopting adequate standards of appointment of public officers in the state financial system.
- 5- Publishing citizen's budgets for local authorities and public divisions which will allow citizen participation and social accountability.
- 6- Enforce the implementation of international ratified treaties as national accredited law.
- 7- Allocate and assign a Budget for Civil Society to apply for and implement anti-corruption projects.

**Recommendation for Civil Society Action:**

- 1- Launch Advocacy campaigns for the parliament to accelerate the process of adopting anti-corruption legislation framework:
  - a. Access to information law
  - b. Freedom of association and expression law
  - c. Asset declaration law

- d. Anti-corruption law**
  - e. Revision of current legislations that allow the corrupt to get away with it**
- 2- Provide capacity building on systems of reporting corruption to all stakeholders.**
  - 3- Establish specialized centers for research to provide recommendations for the government of the best practices in anti-corruption legislations.**
  - 4- Establish strong networks between civil society and seek support from the international organizations and donors to allow space for peer learning and exchange of expertise in order to have a strong unified voice against corruption.**
